For three days, starting from the reality of street workers, we will exchange, enrich our practices, create together, fill up with energy and produce recommendations that will be presented to the European Commission and in the street.


The open space technology will allow each of us to propose a workshop and to bring forth a lot of ideas in a superb organised chaos.

- → Whoever is present is the right person the necessary wisdom and genuine interest are present in the group.
- → Whatever happens is the only thing that could have been let go of regrets and focus on the best possible effort in the present moment.
- → Whenever it starts is the right time take things as they come.
- → When it is over, it is over shorter or longer discussions, depending on the group's wishes.
- → The Law of Two Feet if you find yourself in a situation where you are neither learning nor contributing, use your two feet, go somewhere where you will!
- → Totem animals bees: they circulate and spread ideas butterflies: they take a break or reflect





## **OPEN SPACE TECHNOLOGY** RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PROJECT INITIATOR

ightarrow At the scheduled time and place, post your subject and the time.

### ONCE THE PARTICIPANTS ARE SETTLED, SET THE SCENE:

- → Invite everyone to introduce themselves in a concise manner and in relation to the theme that brings you together.
- → Explain why you have chosen this topic.
- → Invite the group to nominate a facilitator together to lead the discussion.
- → Designate a person to remind you of the elapsed time and decide when to do it.
- → Be the secretary or ask someone to be the secretary. By writing down the highlights of the discussion on the board, you help the bees to know where you stand. This will also help when writing the report.
- → Identify one or more people who will write the report. You can team up with members of your discussion group to complete the report.

#### **REGARDING REPORTING:**

- → Ask for the names of the workshop participants, you will write them down in the report to allow discussions to continue afterwards.
- → During the discussion, write down the salient points.
- → At the end of the discussion, synthesize the strong ideas of your discussion and possibly validate with the group.
- → Write your report using the format available.
- → Designate a person to return as a large group if requested.

On Wednesday, we will take the time to listen to young people from Brussels, to take their opinions and to exchange with them on different themes.


# CREATIVE WORKSHOP
